

Seeing Your Life Through The Lens of The Gospel 13th October 2024

We often get satisfaction from the things we own, clothes, cars, homes, gadgets, or money. There would be something unnatural if we did not. But what happens to us when our possessions begin to 'own' us, when they take a hold us, when we become obsessed with them? Jesus seeks followers who have the freedom to let go of possessions in order to be a servant of others. In whom have you seen this freedom? When have you experienced it yourself?

Growth implies change. That change sometimes means letting go of something we have at this moment: job, status, home, security, or something else we value. There can be an apparent loss in letting go. Yet have you ever found that you gained more than you lost by having the freedom to let go of something to which you had previously clung?

The disciples thought that Jesus was making impossible demands of people following him. He acknowledged that discipleship was impossible to us on our own efforts alone. How have you experienced the benefits of the help of others and of God when you were faced with difficulties in life?

Please note that if you are in the proximity of a defibrillator when an incident occurs e.g. Cardiac Arrest, Heart Attack, Stroke, Choking or if somebody collapses call 999 and then call the First Responders as outlined above. The relevant phone number is displayed on posters in both churches. When you dial 999 the operator will ask you if there is a defibrillator near by and will ask you for the location code. The location code is on the front of the defibrillator box. The operator will then provide you with the code to open the box. The code is also known to the first responders and is available in the sacristy of both churches. On the advice of the defibrillator providers the code is not available to the general public due to fear of tampering.

Proposed changes to Mass schedule for your consideration

The recent retirement of Canon Michael Noonan from our Pastoral Unit necessitates a change to our current mass schedule. In proposing these changes some criteria have guided our deliberations.

1. No masses to be celebrated at the same time on any given day, giving parishioners a greater

opportunity to attend mass across our Pastoral Unit.

2. A greater time gap between masses means one priest potentially could celebrate extra masses.

3. There will be two weekday masses in each church in our Pastoral Unit. The priests of the Unit also celebrate mass weekly in St. Itas hospital and The nursing homes in NCW

In relation to funeral masses there will be no morning mass that morning.

Both churches in Ardagh/Carrickerry and Feohanagh/Castlemahon will continue with the

current practice of seasonal change of mass times. Please be aware that the days and times of masses in some parishes have changed.

It is envisaged that the proposed changes will begin on the Saturday evening the 1st weekend of Advent (November 30th)
