Seeing Your Life Through The Lens of The Gospel

Sunday May 11th 2025

- To fully understand today's short Gospel (Jn.10.27-30) it's important to know how sheep were raised in olden times in the Middle East. They were raised mainly for the wool they produced and had therefore the prospect of a longer life span than sheep in Europe. The shepherd got to know his sheep roaming on the open terrain. So intimate was the relationship of shepherd and flock that they would recognise the voice of the shepherd calling them by name. those who keep pet sheep know all about this. When Jesus claimed a similar relationship with those who believed in him, his listeners had experience pf what he meant.
- The essence of the Christian life is to become attuned to Jesus' voice, gently drawing us towards becoming loving persons. We are aware that today there's the Evil one also tugging at our heart strings with a view to making us selfish. Self centred and less lobing. Today's Gospel reading urges us to distinguish between these two discorded Voices—the more we choose to listen to the voice of our Shepherd, the gift of eternal life will never be stolen from us

Please note that if you are in the proximity of a defibrillator when an incident occurs e.g. Cardiac Arrest, Heart Attack, Stroke, Choking or if somebody collapses call 999 and then call the First Responders as outlined above. The relevant phone number is displayed on posters in both churches. When you dial 999 the operator will ask you if there is a defibrillator near by and will ask you for the location code. The location code is on the front of the defibrillator box. The operator will then provide you with the code to open the box. The code is also known to the first responders and is available in the sacristy of both churches. On the advice of the defibrillator providers the code is not available to the general public due to fear of tampering.
